## UNESCO Director-General condemns killing of social media producer Jorge Méndez Pardo in Colombia

Paris, 4 July 2024 - Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of UNESCO, has condemned the killing of social media producer Jorge Méndez Pardo, in a rural part of the municipality of Tibú, Norte de Santander, in Colombia on 27 June.

*"I condemn the killing of Jorge Méndez Pardo and call for an investigation to ensure that the perpetrators are brought to justice. Social media producers like Jorge must be protected alongside journalists, given their critical role in providing information to audiences,"* said **Audrey Azoulay, UNESCO Director-General**.

Jorge Méndez Pardo, also known as "Jeykon el líder", was a well-known local social media producer and ran a Facebook page *La Gabarra con una imagen diferente*. He was reportedly shot and his body was found next to his vehicle.
