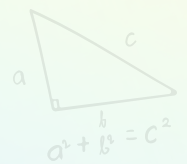

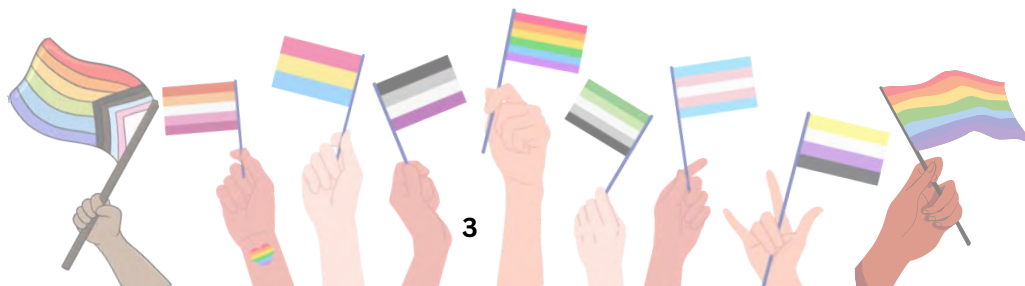


We envision a world where LGBTQ+ people in the STEM community are empowered to achieve success in a safe and supportive space that celebrates their diversity and unique contributions.

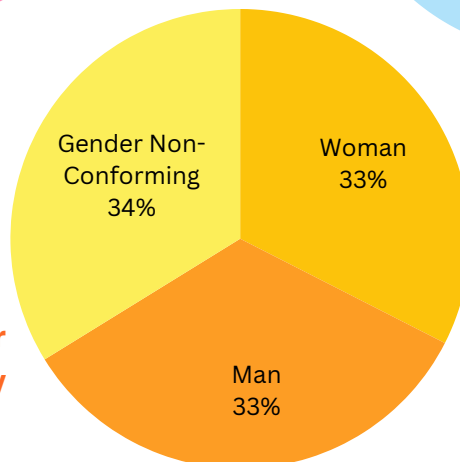

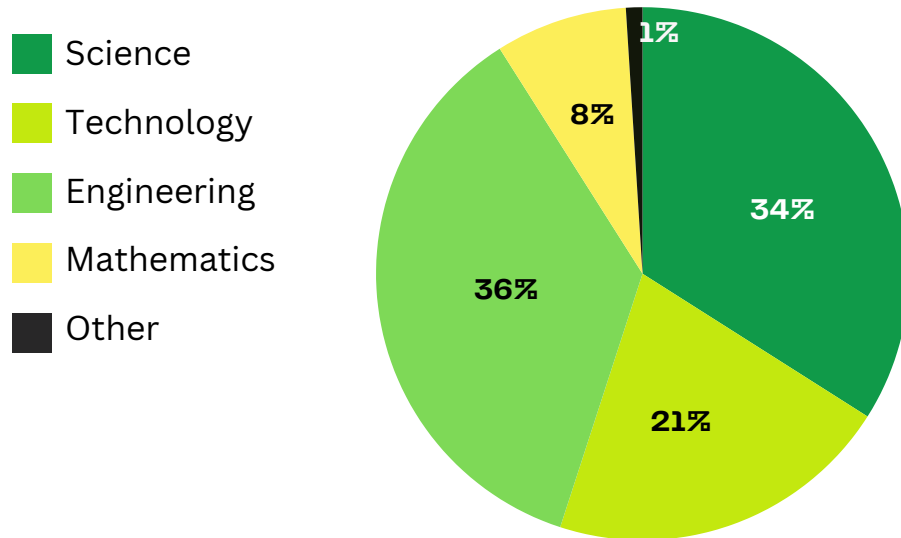

Allyship in Motion by oSTEM moves beyond the messages of “hiring diversity” to give participants the tools necessary to recruit, retain, and support underserved LGBTQ+ candidates on a day-to-day basis. 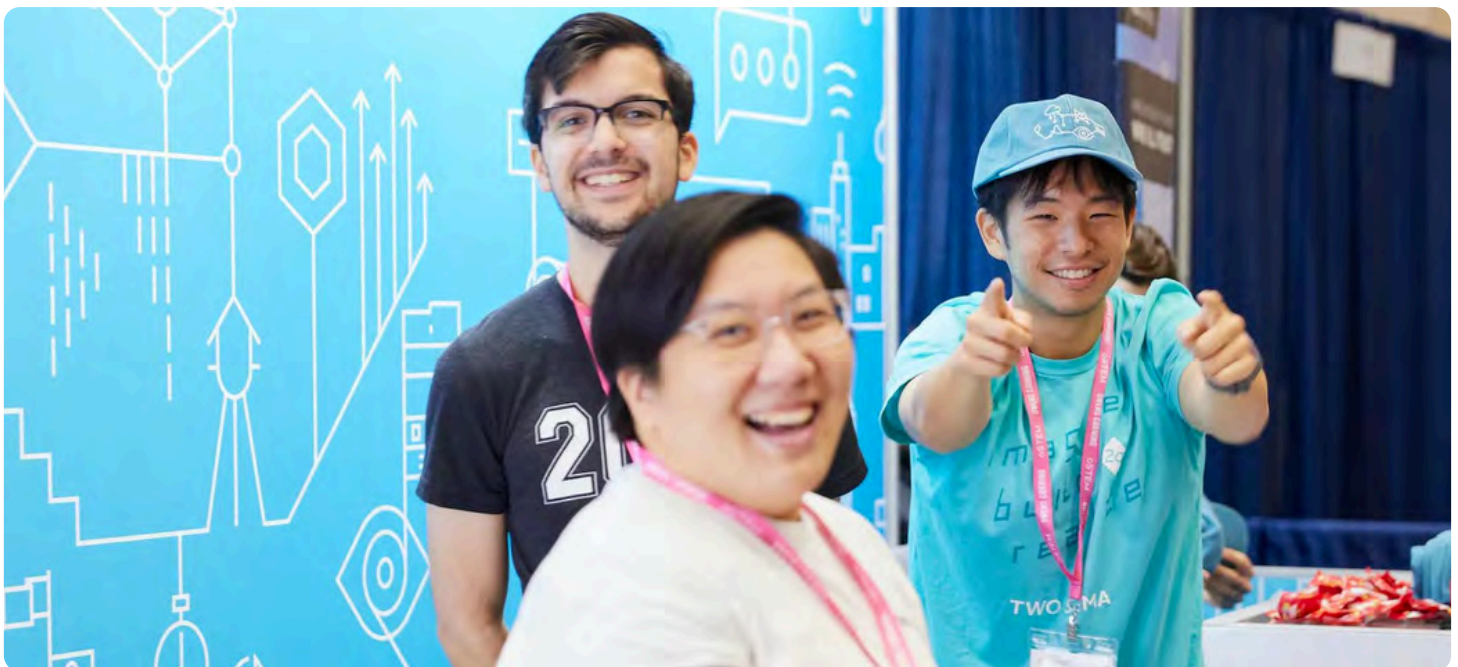

Payment Terms and Cancellation Policy

Accepted forms of payment are check, wire transfer, ACH deposit/EFT, or credit card (will incur 3% fee).

Upon receipt of the signed commitment form, an invoice will be sent to the billing contact with a link to a secure online payment portal. A signed commitment form is a guarantee to pay and all invoices sent to the billing contact will require payment. All outstanding invoices must be paid by 8/15/2024 to guarantee inclusion in exhibitor and sponsorship listings. If your organization has any outstanding invoices with oSTEM by 8/15/2024, you may not be permitted to register.

All financial commitments for the 2024 oSTEM Annual Conference are final. Complete payment is required to receive the value outline. No refunds will be provided for any reason. If a request for a change of exhibitor level or sponsorship is made prior to 8/14/2024, committed funds may be allocated to other 2024 oSTEM Annual Conference opportunities. If a request for cancellation of exhibitor level or sponsorship is made prior to 8/14/2024, 50% of committed funds may be allocated to 2024 oSTEM Annual Conference opportunities and the remaining 50% will be applied to 2025 oSTEM Annual Conference. All commitment forms received after 8/15/2024 will be considered final and payment will be due regardless of exhibitor/sponsor's decision to participate.
