Moonflower Murders

Begins Sunday, September 15, at 9:00 pm

A FORMER BOOK EDITOR turned amateur sleuth and a famous literary detective, who solved the “Magpie Murders,” team up again to unravel a new murder mystery. Susan Ryeland (Lesley Manville) is the literary expert and Atticus Pünd (Tim McMullan) is the clever – and fictional – 1950s detective featured in Alan Conway’s novels. Despite not being “real,” Pünd somehow manages to infiltrate Susan’s world and becomes her friend and guide.

Susan has left publishing and is now living in Crete with her long-time boyfriend, Andreas. But her idyll is disturbed by the shadow of a murder committed at a British country hotel eight years ago. Alan Conway visited the hotel and wrote a novel based on what happened there. Cecily Treherne, the young woman who helps run the hotel, read the book and believed the wrong man had been arrested. Now she has disappeared. When Susan visits the Treherne hotel, she learns more about its former employee found guilty in the murder of Frank Parris. How does this all tie together and can Susan, with Pünd’s help, uncover the secret hidden in the book and find Cecily before it is too late?

Van der Valk

Begins Sunday, September 15, at 10:00 pm

Brilliant, but cynical, commissaris Piet Van der Valk (Marc Warren) solves baffling crimes in 21st-century Amsterdam, which is more prosperous, cosmopolitan and crime-prone than ever. In Season 4, Van der Valk and his team are back at it, in search of criminals, suspects and evidence. In addition to solving murder cases, Van der Valk has to deal with an unwelcome past romance resurfacing as well as to find a way to make one of his beloved team members confront their own mortality.

New baffling crimes this season include the case of a whistleblower who is murdered under police protection. Van der Valk and his crew are called in to make sure the second whistleblower makes it to court to testify and take down a criminal empire. The team is also called in when an environmental campaigner is murdered on the eve of a global conference. And, a scientist researching a potential breakthrough in the treatment of a deadly disease is found dead. Van der Valk’s ex-flame Kalie Tenkers returns to help the team investigate why he was killed and if there is a link to a pharmaceuticals billionaire.

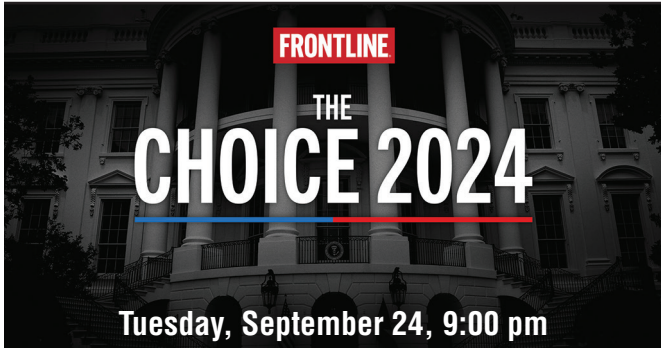
The Abominable Bride

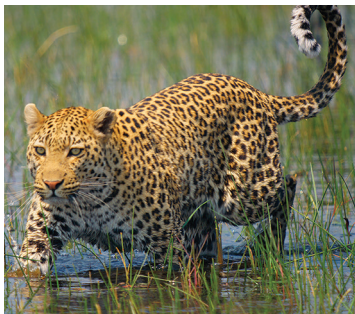


The Fab Four: The Ultimate Beatles Tribute

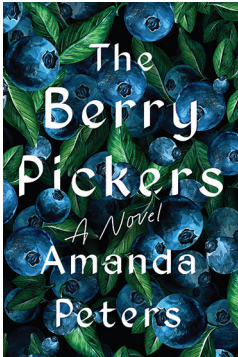
