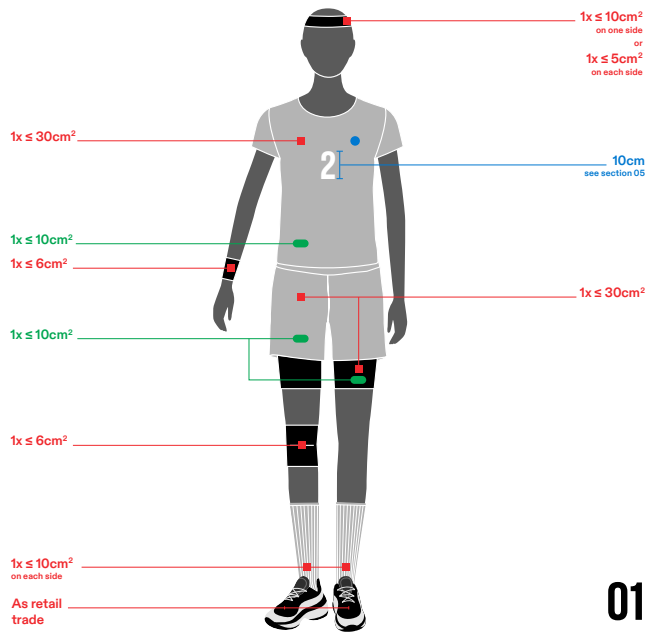
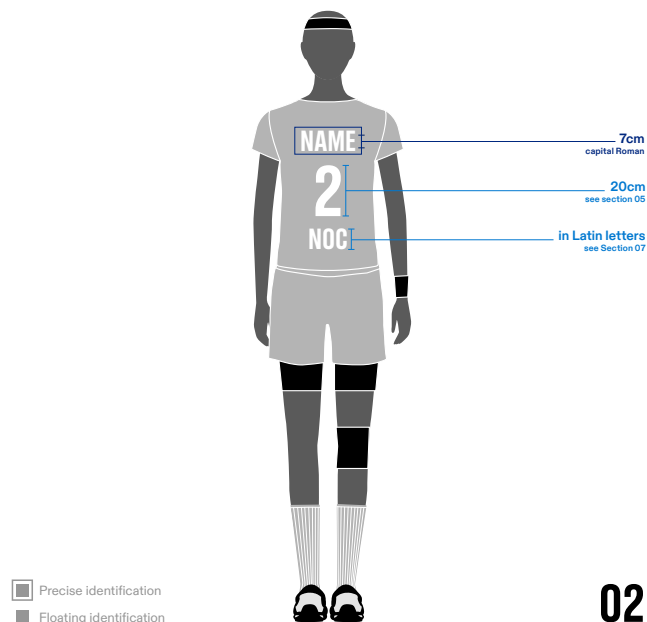

SUBMISSION PROCESS

IHF is requiring its NFs to submit in advance. Further, a final check at technical meeting or at data/passport control will be done.

01 PLAYER FRONT

Identification of the Manufacturer

Clothing

- Shirt | Long-sleeve | shirt | Shorts/Pants | Cycling pants | Tracksuits/Jacket | Sweatshirt (Goalkeeper)** One *Identification of the Manufacturer* [■] per clothing item will be permitted, to a maximum size of 30cm^2 .

Color of the Shirt

The use of fluorescent colours is not permitted. All players of one team who are used as goalkeeper must wear uniforms of the same colour. This also applies to court players who temporarily act as goalkeeper. The colour must distinguish them from the court players of both teams and the goalkeeper(s) of the opposing team.

At Olympic Games, each team must possess three (3) differently coloured sets of players' uniforms:

- one set of light-coloured shirts and one set of light-coloured shorts;
- one set of dark-coloured shirts and one set of dark-coloured shorts;
- one set of alternatively coloured shirts;
- three differently coloured shirts for the goalkeeper;
- shirts for court players acting as goalkeeper in the three colours.

Accessories

- Wristband | Knee and elbow pads/protection | Ankle protection/stabilization** One [■] per item will be permitted, to a maximum size of 6cm^2 .
- Socks** One *Identification of the Manufacturer* [■] per item will be permitted, to a maximum size of 10cm^2 .
- Headgear** One *Identification of the Manufacturer* [■] per item will be permitted, to a maximum size of 10cm^2 or two *Identifications of the Manufacturer*, to a maximum size of 5cm^2 each, placed above each ear.

Eyewear

May carry the *Identification of the Manufacturer* as generally used on products sold through the retail trade during the period of 6 months or more prior to the Games, with the *Identifications* permitted on the lenses so long as such *identifications* are tone-on-tone, engraved into the lens, and is not deemed as conspicuous by the IOC.

Bag | Ball bag

One *Identification of the Manufacturer* per item will be permitted, not greater than 10% of the surface area of the item, to a maximum size of 60cm^2 .

Towel

No *Identification of the Manufacturer* will be permitted.

Shoes/Footwear

Shoes

All footwear items may carry the *Identification of the Manufacturer* as generally used on products sold through the retail trade during the period of 6 months or more prior to the Games.

Product Technology Identification

Clothing

- Shirt | Long-sleeve | shirt | Shorts/Pants | Cycling pants | Tracksuits/Jacket | Sweatshirt (Goalkeeper)** One additional *Product Technology Identification* [●] will be permitted per clothing item to a maximum size of 10cm^2 .

Additional IF Specifications

Section 05

Third Party Identifications (athlete names)

Players must wear clearly legible numbers, the figures must have a height of at least 10cm on the chest. The numbers shall be in a colour which is clearly distinguishable from the main colour of the shirt. Players numbers from 1-99 are allowed only.

Section 07

NOC Emblems and National Identity

The NOC emblem or national flag [●] shall be displayed at chest level on the front of the shirt. The country/territory name (in Latin letters in national language or in English) shall be displayed on the back of the shirt, below the player's number.

All the court players on a handball team must wear identical uniforms. The combinations of colours and design for the two opposing teams must be clearly distinguishable from each other.

Temporary goalkeepers

Temporary goalkeepers must either wear a goalkeeper shirt with the number that they normally have as court player, or they must put on a shirt which is identical with the team's goalkeeper shirt and has holes covered with transparent material that allow a view of the number on the front and back of the regular shirt.

Section 05

Third Party Identifications (athlete names)

The player's surname or popular name (which is identical to the one indicated in the team list) must be displayed above the player's number on the back of the shirt. The names must be written in capital Latin letters measuring a minimum of 7cm high. The NOCs are responsible for the application of the names.

Players must wear clearly legible numbers, the figures must have a height of at least 20cm on the back. The numbers shall be in a colour which is clearly distinguishable from the main colour of the shirt. Players numbers from 1-99 are allowed only.

Section 07

NOC Emblems and National Identity

The country/territory name (in Latin letters in national language or in English) shall be displayed on the back of the shirt, below the player's number.

All the court players on a handball team must wear identical uniforms. The combinations of colours and design for the two opposing teams must be clearly distinguishable from each other.

Temporary goalkeepers

Temporary goalkeepers must either wear a goalkeeper shirt with the number that they normally have as court player, or they must put on a shirt which is identical with the team's goalkeeper shirt and has holes covered with transparent material that allow a view of the number on the front and back of the regular shirt.
