Quota places are allocated to the athlete(s) by name.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

C.1. Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).





Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of World DanceSport Federation, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

C.2. Age requirements

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, athletes must be born on or before 31 of December 2008.

C.3. Additional IF eligibility criteria

Athletes must also comply with the following criteria:

- Adhere to the WDSF Rules and Regulations Manual (Breaking) outlined here
- Must be part of the WDSF Athletes and Competition License system
- Must have a passport of the country (NOC) they represent.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

An NOC can qualify a maximum of two quota places, one per gender, through the World Championships or the Continental Qualifier. In this case, the second quota per NOC per gender could be obtained via the Olympic Qualifier Series.

D.2. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will be allocated one (1) quota place for each gender, on the condition that they meet the eligibility criteria described under section **C. Athlete Eligibility** of this document. In addition to this, the eligible athletes must have participated in the Olympic qualifier series and must finish in the top 24 of the final ranking.

The host country quota is applicable only when the host country does not qualify a maximum quota of two athletes per gender through any events/rankings mentioned in section **D. Qualification Pathway** of this document.

D.3. UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Two (2) male and two (2) female Universality places are made available to eligible NOCs at the Olympic Games Paris 2024, respecting the maximum quota per gender per NOC.

On 1 October 2023, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Universality places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2024. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of Universality places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the Breaking qualification period.

These athletes must participate in the Olympic qualifier series and must finish in the top 24 in the final ranking of the OQS.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

E.1. CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

The WDSF will publish the results of the event within three (3) days after the event on its website.

The WDSF will confirm in writing, via email, to NOCs within five (5) days after the last day of the event, or ranking, the quota places they have obtained. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm in writing, via email, to the WDSF if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in section **G. Qualification Timeline.**

E.2. CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACE

In case where the host country did not qualify a maximum quota of two athletes per gender through the events outlined in section **D. Qualification Pathway** of this document, the WDSF will send a request in writing to the NOC as outlined in **G. Qualification Timeline**.

The WDSF will ask to the NOC if they wish to use the host country place for the eligible athlete(s), as detailed under section **D.2. Host Country Places**, and the NOC will then have two (2) weeks to confirm to the WDSF if they wish to use such quota place.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline, or is declined by the NOC, the quota places will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked athlete, not yet qualified, at the event at which the quota place was obtained, respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC.

Any quota places that cannot be allocated through the event at which the quota place was obtained, will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked athlete, not yet qualified, on the final Olympic qualifier series ranking list respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC.





F.2. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Unused host country places will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked eligible athlete in the Olympic qualifier series ranking list, not yet qualified for the Olympic Games, respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC.

F.3. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Unused Universality places will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked eligible athlete in the Olympic qualifier series ranking list, not yet qualified for the Olympic Games, respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC.
