What data do we collect?

UNESCO collects the following data:

- Personal identification data you directly provide: Name, function/position, postal address, phone number, email address, organization, country of residence, and other relevant information of the contact person (natural person) representing the applicant entity/organization (legal entity).
- Names and nationalities of the project team members.
- Complementary documents such as: official documents demonstrating legal status
 of the applicant entity/organization (legal entity); letters of support from
 governmental authorities or public institutions and/or from project partners; official
 documents demonstrating the international membership of the applicant
 organization (both institutional and individual); official document proving that recent
 activities of the applicant organization have been carried out in several countries
 around the world; and pro forma invoices.

Please be mindful that the information and documents you provide may, in some cases, include the personal data of other individuals in your entity/organization (e.g., project team members). Always ensure you have their consent to share this information prior to uploading to the IFCD platform.

How do we collect your data?

We collect data and process data when you:

- Register to apply to the IFCD.
- Voluntarily complete the IFCD online application form.

How will we use your data?

UNESCO collects your data for:

- Processing of your registration, managing your account and evaluating your application.
- · Project implementation and monitoring.
- Email you with information on your application.
- Statistical purposes.

How do we store your data?

UNESCO securely stores your data at UNESCO Premises (Paris, France) or on cloud services used by UNESCO. Your data will not be published for general access nor disclosed or sold to third parties. UNESCO, however, assumes no responsibility for the security of this information.

We keep personal data for as long as necessary for the purposes described in this privacy notice, in accordance with our applicable records retention and disposition schedules.
