Global observation of the "International Day of Zero Waste"

Excellencies, Ladies and gentlemen, Dear friends.

I would like to begin by thanking Her Excellency Madam Gülnur AYBET, Ambassador and Permanent Delegate of Türkiye to UNESCO for her kind invitation to attend and address this event.

The *International Day of Zero Waste*, celebrated annually on 30 March, is a critical initiative to remind us all of our duties as customers and consumers. We must all consider the origins and impacts of the goods and products we purchase. **We must reuse and recycle what we can, when we can**.

While being conscious of this attitude on a daily basis may require extra efforts for those of our generation, we should at least make sure it become instinctive for our children. This is why school curricula must be adapted to integrate these notions.
